Updates

UCC Update

In November 1999, the Uniform Construction Code (UCC), Act 45 of 1999, was signed into law. The legislation directed the Pennsylvania Department of Labor and Industry (DLI) to promulgate regulations to implement a uniform statewide building code in Pennsylvania. DLI has divided the regulations into two parts: the first addressing training and certification of code officials, and the second addressing administrative issues.

The final-form training and certification regulation was published in the Pennsylvania Bulletin on April 13. DLI began accepting certification applications on July 15. DLI has published a booklet on code official registration and certification requirements. A copy of the booklet can be downloaded from www.dli.state.pa.us or by calling DLI at 717-787-3323.

On May 3, 2002, the DLI submitted its proposed administration and enforcement regulations to the Office of the Attorney General. On June 10, the Department received three substantive questions from that office, which they are currently answering. Once the questions are answered by DLI, review by the Attorney General will continue. After approval by the Attorney General, the proposed regulation will be submitted to the Independent Regulatory Review Commission and the legislative committees, and a 30-day public comment period will occur, with three hearing across Pennsylvania. DLI anticipates the regulations will be finalized by the end of the year and will become effective 90 days later.

The Governor's Center for Local Government Services is setting up the Uniform Codes Academy. The academy will provide code training and certification testing at multiple sites throughout the Commonwealth. For more information contact Mitch Hoffman at (888) 223-6837.

Training

New Energy Code Training

The PHRC has rolled out the new energy code training program intended for all building contractors, design professionals and code officials. The program offers a four-hour session for all audiences covering the general code requirements and the various compliance paths. This program goes beyond the basics of the code. It discusses how to meet the new code requirements and provides a tie between energy requirements and life-health-safety requirements in the IRC.

The program also offers an optional two-hour session on how to administer and enforce the energy code provisions. This is especially important since most municipalities that currently enforce a building code do not enforce the energy requirements. This portion of the program provides an overview of plan reviews and how to pick up many of the energy. While this part of the program is targeted at building code officials, anyone can attend.

The development of this program was funded in part by the US Department of Energy, the PA Department of Community and Economic Development, and the Pennsylvania Builders Association. To schedule a program in your area, please call Tracy DeSoto at (814) 865-2341.

Building Code Training Website

The PA Code Training Consortium's (CTC) website (www.engr.psu.edu/ctc)

provides a database of all building code related training available in and around Pennsylvania. It allows anyone to perform a quick search on building code training by region of the state or by target audience.

Accessibility Training Scheduled for the Fall

The PHRC has partnered with the Pennsylvania Council on Independent Living and with the Eastern Paralyzed Veterans Association, Lift and Independence for Today (LIFT) and Centre Region Code Administration to present a seminar on the Accessibility Requirements of the International Building Code (IBC). The IBC is soon to be adopted in Pennsylvania. The course is to be held at the Bryce Jordan Center on the Penn State campus on August 14th.

The session will include an insight to Chapters 10 (Means of Egress), 11 (accessibility) and 34 (Existing Buildings) of the IBC, the accessibility referenced standard ICC/ANSI A117.1 1998, as well as the proposed revision of the American with Disabilities Act Accessibility Guidelines and its integration with the IBC.

LIFT will also sponsor a separate training event oriented toward consumers and advocates. This event will explain how the new code legislation affects accessibility in Pennsylvania and will give suggestions for advocacy efforts to insure enforcement of the code. Building Code Training

Workshop

Moisture Control Workshop

The PHRC will be sponsoring a one-day workshop on "Avoiding Moisture-Related Problems in Residential Buildings" in the Harrisburg and Pittsburgh areas sometime in October 2002.

The objective of this workshop is to provide systematic and comprehensive coverage of the control of moisture and the avoidance of moisture-related problems in building enclosures. While largely directed at residential buildings (detached houses and low-rise housing), the principles covered apply to all building enclosures on all buildings. The program is directed at both the home-building industry and the professional design community.

This workshop will focus on the avoidance of moisture-related problems as opposed to dealing at length with the consequences. By understanding the building science fundamentals; the interdependence of heat, air and moisture control; the sources of moisture; the means for moisture movement and the thresholds for performance, moisture problems can be avoided. Equally important, one needs to be able to recognize a bad design and to be able to diagnose an existing situation.

This workshop will address the whole building enclosure, namely, roofing systems, wall systems above and below grade, basements and crawlspaces (both vented and not vented). The management of wind-driven rain and condensation and the provision of drainage, convective drying, air-pressure moderation across the screen and mold avoidance are examples of specific topics that will be dealt with.

Time will be devoted to discussing the future statewide building code and any moisture-related provisions in both the IRC 2000 and the new PA-Alternative Energy Code that was developed by the PHRC.

Research

Climate Chamber

The PHRC is currently engaged in a comprehensive program of research on the performance of wall systems. Of particular interest is the performance of the exterior sheathing membrane, the cavity behind the cladding (or rainscreen) and the contribution of convective ventilation to drying. This work is funded by ASHRAE, the NSF and the PHRC.

The photograph below shows our new climate chamber and three research assistants, Chris Schumacher, Xing Shi and Joseph Piñon, and Bill Splain, our technician. This chamber can simulate indoor and both winter and summer outdoor conditions.
