ABOUT THE CONFERENCE

The Pennsylvania Housing Research Center (PHRC), housed in the Civil & Environmental Engineering Department and the Architectural Engineering Department at the Pennsylvania State University, is delighted to announce the 4th Residential Building Design and Construction (RBDC) Conference. The 4th RBDC Conference will provide a forum for researchers, architects, engineers, other design professionals, product manufacturers, builders, developers, and code officials to discuss challenges to sustainable, energy efficient, healthy, environmentally friendly, natural hazard resistant, and affordable residential construction, and share recent research findings, state-of-the-art technologies, and innovative projects and approaches in the field.
